The Club had most of the second hand tackle on display and managed to sell a few items. Kennick Fly Fishers Association AGM - Oakford Club - Kingsteignton March 4th start 1930

1. The Chairman, John Hern opened the AGM meeting and welcomed members to the first actual meeting in 2 years. Members were thanked for coming along (30) despite restrictions being lifted Coronavirus was still with us. Unfortunately Dil Singh had tested positive for Covid so was unable to attend, but JH would run through some pre sent questions after the meeting. Raffle would also follow the AGM, thanks to SW Lakes, Mark Underhill, Fish4flies.com, Stefan Mirasole and KFFA for donating prizes.

2. Apologies - Apologies had been received from Mike Stone, Dil Singh, Richard Mason, Ron Edmunds, Alan Tudor, Carole Tudor, Darren Penfold, Hilary Herring, John Crosse, Gordon White, Paul Gale, John Lowe, Adrian Buckle, Bill Hynes, Ron Weaver, John Kilvert, Peter Shazell, Jerry Purchase, Anthony Hughes, Dave Grove, Steve Morgan, Mike Peppitt, Rob Spooner, Graham Read, and Paul Fitzmaurice.

3. Approval of 2021 Minutes - The Chairman asked if there were any comments or questions on the minutes of the previous AGM held via Zoom April 13th 2021 and distributed with the May 2021 Newsletter. As there were no questions it was proposed that they be accepted as a true record.

Proposed: Gavin Argyle. Seconded: Bill Hande. Unanimously approved. The minutes were then signed by the Chairman.

4. Matter Arising - Membership proposal had been discussed at last years Zoom meeting but due to low numbers on the call it couldn't go to the vote and got rolled over to this year. Proposal is that all memberships to go to £10. This was due to rising Insurance costs having doubled for boat and generator. JH said we were still the cheapest club in the area and membership fee can quickly be recouped using discounts. Went to the vote and all were in favour.
5. Chairman's Report - Sent out prior to meeting, JH touched on high lights for the year, Darren Penfold and Paul Wicks won the Kennick Pairs and Darren Penfold won the Peninsula Classic. Andy Gooding won the Snowbee Top Rod, going right down to the final competition of the year, presentation of the rod will take place at Roadford Fly Fair. Alex Venn was top Junior, Alec Hoare was top Senior, Darren Penfold took the Fred Pike Cup, Ray Martin took the trophy for best caught rainbow by a member 4lbs 2oz. Chairman's trophy went to Gerry Scutt. Instagram, Facebook and re vamped Website were proving popular and gaining more traction. Some great bank clearing took place in January, thanks to the 10 members who came along, thanks to Mark Baxendale who provided the machinery on the day. We will be back on the road this year with our 2nd hand tackle, Roadford, Devon County, Honiton and Chagford are planned. JH thanked Tom Hendy and Andy Watson for continued help patrolling the banks of Kennick. JH thanked Simon Kidd and Russell Weston for their continued support of the Top Rod.

6. Comp Secretary's Report - In the absence of Darren Penfold, John Hern went through slides of 2021 and competition statistics.

7. Treasurer's Report - Tom Hendy went through the set of Accounts which showed -1323 income over expenditure. The reason for the negative figure was due to the match funding needed to help pay for the generator. The Chairman thanked TH for preparing the accounts.

The Chairman asked for the Chairman's report to be adopted at the meeting. Proposed: Chris Bolt, Seconded: Gavin Argyle.

The Chairman asked for the Treasurer's report to be adopted at the meeting. Proposed: Bill Hande, Seconded: Dave Hockin.

The Chairman asked for the Comp Secretary's report to be adopted at the meeting, Proposed: Gavin Argyle, Seconded: Chris Bolt. All Unanimously approved 8. Election of Officers and Committee - JH Chairman had completed 2nd year of 3rd 3 year stint so no need to go to the vote.

Tom Hendy - Treasurer for the next year. Proposed: Chris Bolt, Seconded: John Winson. Unanimously approved. Election of all Committee who were happy to stand for a further year - en bloc - Proposed: Mike Steer, Seconded: Alec Hoare. Unanimously approved.

Bill Hande commented that on behalf of the members he wanted to thank JH and TH for what they did for the Club, as a lot of work goes on in the background, inparticular with cataloguing the sales items.

9. Agenda Items received in writing 14 days in advance - Email received from Graham Read looking for support to improve mobile coverage in Christow which covers the Kennick area - email to be forwarded to members on how to write to MP.

10. AOB - Questions were asked, should the Club re visit purchasing a second boat? Any considerations would need to go via SW Lakes for approval and Mark has already increased the size of his fleet. This prompted a discussion on the 10 year plan for existing boat at Wimbleball and was it on target. Suggestion was to lower the discount to members to 25% from 50% thus reducing the period of recouping monies, this would still offer value for money. Committee would investigate and review before 2023 season.

11. Chairman's closing remarks - The Chairman thanked all members for coming along to the AGM, reviewed Member benefits, including % on offer. He remarked that the club was in a healthy position and thanked his team for continued support and looked forward to the 2022 season. We have a great programme of events in 2022, 5 bank and 5 boat events, we will be fishing at Kennick, Wimbleball, Hawkridge, Blagdon and Clatworthy. Mark Underhill will continue to supply this year. Look out for all events including Kennick Pairs, Classic and Scierra Pairs on Wimbleball during the season. Meeting closed 2000.

12. SWLT - JH had already asked for questions to SW Lakes in advance and in Dil's absence went through the Q&A. This proved to be an interesting feature and would be repeated next year.

13. Raffle took place - Stefan Mirasole won a Catch and Release ticket from SW Lakes, Bill Hande won a Kennick Boat ticket, Tom Hendy won a Wimbleball Bank ticket, Chris Bolt and Mike Herring won a Fish4flies box of flies, Alan Riddell won a bottle of wine, Ron Manning won the Chocolates and Rob Boniface won the leader wallet.

Bargain Boxes Fly Tying materials were on display for members.

Snowbee Teams - Siblyback - April 10th



Arriving on site at 7:55am I was greeted with a bright sunny day. However, there was a bite in the weather; notably the 4.5 degrees temperature and gusting wind, which increased from 15mph early on to an estimated 25mph by days end. However, that didn't stop the 12 anglers that had entered The Snowbee 4 man team open. The anglers, now 'bacon buttied' up, 'coffeed' up and tackled up, headed towards the water at 9:15am for a 9:30 start.

Because of the strong SSW wind, some pre-competition practice, and knowledge of stocking location some days earlier, all the anglers felt that the best location was the East bank; a gentle stroll down from the car park. Six anglers headed towards the Two Meadows with the other 6 spreading themselves between Crylla Bay, the stones and Stocky Bay. Whilst chatting in the car park before the start of fishing, despite the cold lots of buzzers filled the air. However, most anglers chose to attach an assortment of lures and blobs for their days fishing.

The competition started at 9:30 and within 30 minutes the first anglers, Mike Stone and Peter Brown, had caught their bag limit for the first zone (five fish). By the time the close of the first time period was announced with the hooter (12:30pm), all but a small number of anglers had caught their limit of 5 fish and were waiting to cross a 'no man's land' line to the afternoon's fishing area where they were ready to lay claim to a swim before they started a 45 minute lunch break. Fishing started again at 1:15pm and by 2:35pm all anglers had filled their bag; a twenty year first for me, where a competition finished early as all competitors had caught their limit! Including a stunning rainbow caught by John Hern weighing 3lbs 7oz.

Report from Mark Baxendale.



Mike Herring's GRAVADLAX (for a 2 – 3lb Rainbow)

First fillet your fish and pull out all the cross bones Lay each side on tin foil with the skin side facing down.

On each side sprinkle approx one tablespoonful of <u>salt</u>. Leave for approx 2 hours. Then pour off all the liquid (the salt will have 'firmed' up the flesh).

Sprinkle on each side a dessert spoonful of <u>dried Dill</u>. Grind <u>black pepper</u> on to both sides. Sprinkle a tablespoonful of <u>sugar</u> on to both sides. Splash on to both sides plenty of <u>Sherry or Brandy</u> or similar. (I use plenty of sherry!)

> Put both sides back together and double wrap in foil then put in the fridge.

Turn twice a day for four days and watch out for 'leakage'!

Carve like you would smoked salmon. Serve with <u>Dill Sauce</u>

I buy <u>Dill Mustard</u> and mix 50:50 with <u>Mayonnaise</u> to make the <u>Dill Sauce</u>

Enjoy!

Note: it will keep for at least a week in the fridge. It also freezes well for 3 months.

If you haven't tried the above you are missing out!

Thanks Mike again for sharing your secret recipe!
